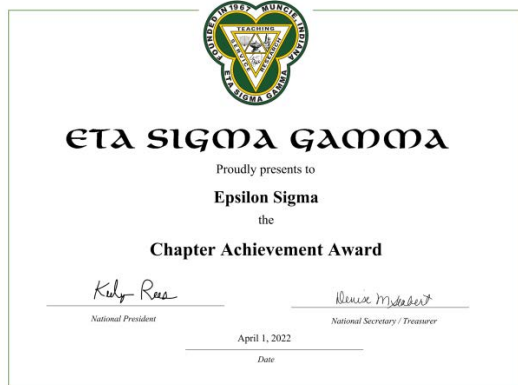

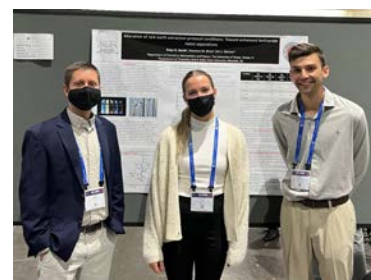

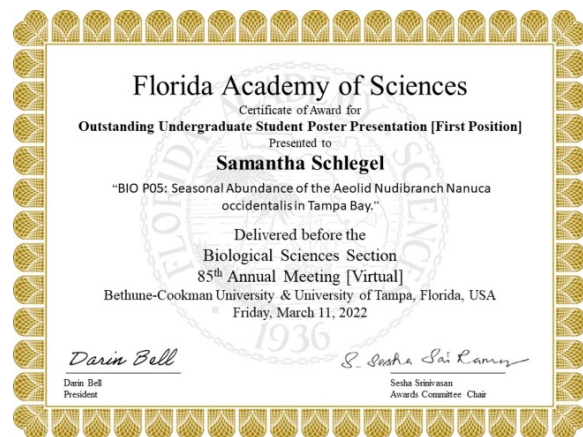


The Remote Area Medical (RAM) clinic is a pop-up medical clinic targeting care for the uninsured and underrepresented patients in our population. The RAM organization is a non-profit organization based in Tennessee and provides over \$174 million of free healthcare each year across multiple states. This RAM clinic took place in Ft. Lauderdale and served 321 patients and provided \$138,000 in medical, dental, and vision care. Four faculty members: **Professor Rom Delacroix**, **Professor Jauna Royal**, **Professor Julie Umberger**, and **Professor Melissa Cole** supervised 6 MSN and 9 BSN students assisting with care at this clinic. These RAM pop-up clinics are possible through the volunteer efforts of all the providers and support personnel.
